Ms. Cobb stated that proper publication was made to allow the Board to conduct a public hearing on the District's 2023 budget. Director Turner opened the public hearing on the District's proposed 2023 budget. There being no public comment on the District's budget, the public hearing was closed.

Thereupon, Director Turner moved to adopt the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES, ADOPTING A BUDGET, SETTING FORTH MILL LEVIES, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE GENERAL FUND IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE TIMNATH RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 3, LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY 2023, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER 2023,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Timnath Ranch Metropolitan District No. 3 has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published on November 2, 2022 in The Fort Collins Coloradoan, a newspaper having general circulation within the boundaries of the District, pursuant to statute, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on November 9, 2022, and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TIMNATH RANCH METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 3 OF LARIMER COUNTY, COLORADO:

- Section 1. <u>2023 Budget Revenues</u>. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 2. <u>2023 Budget Expenditures</u>. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 3. <u>Adoption of Budget for 2023.</u> That the budget as submitted and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted as the budget of the Timnath Ranch Metropolitan District No. 3 for calendar year 2023.
- Section 4. <u>2023 Levy of Property Taxes.</u> That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the budget from property taxes for the 2023 Budget year is \$645.77. That the 2022 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Larimer County Assessor, is \$18,419.

- A. <u>Levy for General Operating Fund</u>. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2023 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 0.000 mills upon each dollar of the 2022 total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District.
- B. <u>Levy for General Obligation Bonds and Interest</u>. That for the purposes of meeting all general obligation bonds and interest approved at elections of the District during the 2023 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 25.040 mills upon each dollar of the 2022 total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District.
- C. <u>Levy for Contractual Obligations</u>. That for the purposes of meeting all general contractual obligations approved at election of the District during the 2023 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 10.020 mills upon each dollar of the 2022 total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District.
- Section 5. <u>Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits</u>. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.
- Section 6. <u>Certification to County Commissioners</u>. The District's manager is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Larimer County, Colorado, the 35.060 mill levy for the District hereinabove determined and set. That said certification shall be in substantially the following form:

2023 BUDGET MESSAGE

Timnath Ranch Metropolitan District No. 3 is a quasi-municipal corporation organized and operated pursuant to provisions set forth in the Colorado Special District Act and was formed in September 2007. The District was established as part of a "Multiple District Structure" for the community located in the Town of Timnath, Colorado and is generally located east of Interstate 25 and Larimer County Road 3, north of Larimer County Road 36, south of Harmony Road and West of County Road 1. Along with its companion Districts No. 2 & 4 ("Financing Districts") and District No. 1 (Operating District), this District was organized to provide financing for the design, acquisition, construction and installation of street and roadway improvements; street landscaping, signage, monuments, and lighting; safety protection; park and recreation improvements; and sanitation and storm drainage; and to provide the operation and maintenance of these improvements.

The District has no employees at this time and all operations and administrative functions are contracted.

The budget is prepared on the modified accrual basis of accounting, which is consistent with the basis of accounting used in presenting the District's financial statements.

In preparing the 2023 budget, the following goals are foremost for the District:

- Provide the level of street, safety, drainage, and park and recreational services as desired by the property owners and residents of the District in the most economic manner possible.
- Provide an unwavering commitment to honoring the District's debt obligations and contractual agreements.

Overview

Highlights of the 2023 budget include the following:

- The assessed valuation (AV) for District No. 3 increased from \$4,539 to \$18,419 and the AV from the Timnath Development Authority (TDA) increased from \$237,614 to \$641,802 from 2022 to 2023.
- Budgeted General Fund revenues increased from \$6,417 in 2022 to \$17,524 in 2023.

General Fund

Revenues

The primary source of revenues for the General Fund are property taxes generated by the mill levy that is assessed by the District. In 2023, the mill levy of 20.040 mills will be split, 10.020 mills will be transferred to District No. 1 for operations and maintenance and 10.020 mills will be transferred to District No. 4 for repayment of existing debt. The total property tax and specific ownership tax is expected to be \$13,900.

Expenditures

The District's expenditures consist of the transfer to District No. 1 of \$6,946 for operations, a transfer to District No. 4 of \$6,946 for a repayment of outstanding debt obligations and \$7 in treasurer's fees, for total budgeted expenditures of \$13,900.

Fund Balance/Reserves

The fund balance of the District's General Fund is budgeted at \$0 due to District No. 1 holding all TABOR reserves.

Debt Service Fund

Revenues

The primary source of revenues for the General Fund are property taxes generated by the mill levy that is assessed by the District. In 2023, the District will assess a mill levy of 15.020 mills. The total property tax and specific ownership tax is expected to be \$10,418.

Expenditures

The District has budgeted for \$6 for treasurer's fees and \$0 in contingency.

Fund Balance/Reserves

The projected ending fund balance in 2023 for the Debt Service Fund is \$16,829.
